



Musicians and Other Performers at The Sunday Artisan Market

The Sunday Artisan Market welcomes musicians and other performers to entertain a random audience on Sundays during scheduled Market hours. Here's what you need to know:

Who We Are: Founded in 1991, The Sunday Artisan Market is an independent cooperative of local artists and crafters who sell their handmade products to the public.

Where We Are: Our Market occupies the Ann Arbor Farmers' Market space, 315 Detroit St., at the intersection of Fifth Ave and Detroit Street in the historic Kerrytown™ district. We are an open-air venue with a roof covering the market aisles and all vendor booths.

When We're Open: Sundays from 11am-4pm, April-December. The Market is closed on Easter and may be closed on other Sundays for special events. Please visit our website's Events page for more information:

When & Where You Can Play at the Market: Performers can occupy, by appointment, a booth or other designated location at the market. The market manager will let you know the location where you can perform.

Performers are granted a 4-hour time slot, from 11 a.m. until 3 p.m. as follows:

- 1 hour — Setup
- 2 hours — Performance
- 1 hour — Teardown

You do not have to pay for the performance space, but there are some guidelines you will be asked to follow.

Guidelines

- Market Operating Rules — You are expected to abide by our rules and regulations. This information is available on our website at <https://sundayartisanmarket.org/wp-content/uploads/2019/10/Operating-Rules-Revised-10-2019.pdf>. You are also expected to abide by city guidelines, including No Smoking, No Alcohol, and No Open Flames at the market.
- Performance Space — The area designated for a performance will be based on available space at the market on that day. You will be assigned one of these locations:
 - Vendor Booth — Booth sizes vary, from approximately 7 feet wide (frontage) by 5 feet deep (some spaces are slightly larger).
 - Market "Island" — a large, open space on the west side of Fifth Ave., adjacent to the market space
- Amplification — Low amplification is permitted for electronic instruments. Volume must be adjusted to an acceptable level so as not to disturb Market business. The market manager will determine an acceptable volume level.
- Electricity — Electricity is available throughout the market space and also on the market "island." If you require electricity, please bring a 25-foot, heavy-duty extension cord and a surge protector.
- Donations — You may place a tip jar/open case for donations/tips.
- CD Sales — You may sell CD's on which you are listed as a musician.
